CHORUS research consortium brings together health researchers from West Africa, South Asia and the UK. We work with communities, health professionals and city level decision makers to co-design and co-implement urban health system strengthening initiatives that respond to the needs of urban populations, particularly the most vulnerable.

Now in the 6th and final year, we have interesting findings to share from our 8 large projects and 17 smaller projects, across our four research pillars

CHORUS RESEARCH PILLARS

LINKING THE PLURALITY OF PROVIDERS:



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CHORUS research highlights the need for renewed and focused efforts to link informal and private providers to the wider health system, to create transparent governance structures and improve population data coverage. Such policy actions can accelerate the achievement of a more equitable urban health system.



MULTI SECTORAL COLLABORATION:



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Effective multi-sectoral action is critical to address wider determinants of health, and the growing health crisis amongst the urban poor. Our projects in Ghana, Nigeria, Nepal and Bangladesh offer evidence and policy action on addressing the current challenges and strengthening multisectoral action.



RESPONDING TO THE DOUBLE BURDEN OF COMMUNICABLE AND NON-COMMUNICABLE DISEASES:



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CHORUS highlights the need for urban specific, multi-sectoral approaches that recognise the role of local city governments, link providers and understand and respond to the diversity of urban populations.



IDENTIFYING, REACHING AND ENGAGING THE URBAN POOR:



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Urban poverty is wide ranging, hard to detect, and often overlooked or excluded from data used by decision makers. CHORUS outputs share evidence on how preventative and curative health services can better reach the urban poor.
